**President's Message #5.....**



Ah yes, it must be gun show season. Bitterly cold in Fargo, snow blowing and icy roads in and all around Mandan, and dodging icy patches, deer and pheasants on the road to Pierre. Oh well, the camaraderie, haggling, and seeing old friends makes up for it. All too soon, the show season is over and we have to find other pursuits to occupy our thoughts and weekends. For collectors like myself, it is the never ending hunt for the perfect fit to our collection and the agonizing planning of the display for the next year. For dealers, it is the continuous stream of buying and selling their wares to a public that seems to have an endless appetite for weapons old and new. Most of the dealers with whom I have talked, are continuing to have good sales in spite of the fact that our elected officials continue to drive our economy into an abyss. Hopefully you, our membership, are weathering the economic chaos without significant damage to you and yours.

I decided it was time to challenge the apparent system of beliefs in this message, so turning to other things, it is time to bring a few issues to light related to our gun shows. After attending shows for several years, it is apparent that there are vendors out there who believe they own the tables they rent at DTGCA shows and can do whatever they wish with them. The bottom line in all this is that if a vendor is unable to make it to a show, the show manager, not the vendor will decide what happens to the tables and who rents them. This same thing applies to the death of a vendor. The show manager will decide what happens to the tables. On many occasions, the family of the deceased continues to sell the merchandise that is left. Simply put, the show manager makes the decision on who gets tables at the shows, polices the merchandise requirements according to Board policy, and decides the location of the vendors. If you personally do not use your tables at a gun show, they revert back to the show. The bottom line is that DTGCA owns the tables. The mindset that vendors own the tables needs immediate correction. While show managers try to accommodate peoples wishes and requests, it is not always possible. I know this was the case at the Trophy Show and Aberdeen Show. The fire marshal required some tables be removed in Sioux Falls and renovation in Aberdeen cost that show a few tables. Hopefully this was communicated effectively to the affected vendors.


# JUDGES CHOICE AWARD

## And Now The Rest of the Story



If you will recall in the Winter Edition of the Newsletter there was a Special Feature on the *Story of the Engraved Winchester M66* by Hank Vogel of Winona, MN. Here is the Rest of the Story. This exquisite Winchester Model 1866-relief engraved rifle in near mint condition, did change hands (despite a healthy reserve) on March 11th, 2008 at the James Julia Auction House.

My wife and I drove out to Fairfield, Maine, through a blizzard, to attend the Auction at Julia's facility. This was also an opportunity to visit our daughter and her family in Middletown, CT and then to attend the famous Baltimore, MD gun show the following weekend. Needless to say, I purchased several guns at the auction and at the Baltimore Gun Show.

We sat through two days of fine firearms auction bidding at Julia's. What an experience! Our fancy Winchester M1866 rifle took top honors, receiving the highest price.

It is not my intention for this to be a commercial, however, the Julia Auction Co. people were outstandingly friendly. We toured all the departments including the photo area. We talked with the expert appraisal people and even Jim Julia, the owner, and members of his family.

The monies received from the auction enabled us to purchase 82 acres of hunting land in Houston Co., MN. (the best big buck rated area in MN!) The property has an area of 7-9 acres of open field and a nice spot to build a hunting cabin. Last summer we had several working get-togethers there to clear some old logs and brush and made a nice level pad for our classic 1974 GMC, self contained, motor coach.

Last fall our extended family hunted the property for turkey and deer. We had some luck, however the two owners adjacent to our property had their acreage logged during the hunting season. Such is luck!

Next fall we should have some excellent hunting.

Attached is a photo of our present campsite. Come fall of '09, we plan to have a hunting cabin erected for the family.

## President's message continued.....

Vendors mistakenly believing they own and control the tables has helped create another issue for which I have heard many complaints. At such shows as the Trophy Show in Sioux Falls, the guideline limit is 24 feet of table space per vendor. There are vendors who have a lot more than that for various reasons, including the fact that they have been wrongly given or granted them by people who no longer use them or have simply assimilated them through the death of another vendor. There is a long list of people who want to set up at the Trophy Show, but cannot get tables. The amount of table space per vendor needs to be fixed and fixed quickly so we can better accommodate our members, perhaps starting with members who set up at a lot of our shows, not just a couple of the high attendance ones along the I-29 corridor.


Last but not least on my list is the issue about which I receive a large number of complaints, particularly at the Sioux Falls Trophy Show, but also includes a majority of the other shows. The complaints have to do with people who are not vendors being in the show venue during setup. When I talked to three of the offenders, they said it was their best buying time. In other words, they like to cherry pick. Of course, this seriously compromises security, among other things, having extra people getting in the way at set up time. I think there are at least two possible approaches to handling this issue. One is to charge for a pass to get in on Friday afternoon and evening. I think a pass for someone who thinks they deserve to get the best buys first is worth \$50.00, although for a show like the Trophy Show in Sioux Falls, I think \$100.00 is scarcely enough for the privilege. The second way to handle this issue is to ban everyone who is not a vendor and have sufficient security to enforce it. Of course, this means show managers will have to be more careful about how many vendor passes they allow someone to have. If someone is helping at a table, fine, but in many cases I have seen, the vendor simply grabs an extra vendor pass or two for their friends or special customers. In some cases, the person is a friend of the show manager.

In talking to some folks, they make excuses for certain people by saying they drop a lot of money during some of their Friday forays. Personally, I find it offensive that someone would be allowed in simply because of selectiveness. I guess you can always respond by saying that someone who spends a few grand is important because of the amount of money they spend, whereas someone who is simply looking for a hot deal on a rifle to use to supply meat for their family will not spend as much, but I had better not give my response to that statement. My mother told me that using words like come to mind were not good for polite society, let alone put in print. Suffice it to say that any kind of elitism is greatly offensive and has no place in an organization such as DTGCA that touts itself as being family oriented. I do not have an absolute answer to the issue, but I have talked to several vendors and without a formal tally, they appear to lean at least 3 to 1 in favor of keeping people out of the shows until officially open to the public. Vendors, let us know what you think and how you would like to see this handled. Give us a call or drop us a line. The general membership is also welcome to weigh in on the issue.

I knew when I started planning this message that it was time to bring some of these things out in the open. Will things be popular or accepted? I am afraid not always. However, it lets the membership know that they are not ignored. On that note, something that I occasionally hear is that the inner workings of DTGCA are secret and part of a "good old boy" network. Well folks, what we do is not magic, secret, or voodoo. It is a group of dedicated people who form the officers and board of this great organization to continually strive to improve it, and do so without compensation. There is nothing to hide and if we find errors or mistakes, we simply need to fix them. In keeping with that, the Board minutes will be published with the newsletter. That will keep the membership informed and help deal with the destructive rumor mill.

Last but not least for this month is the suggestion by members and vendors that DTGCA keep a list of FFL dealers who are willing to do gun transfers to residents of their states. Our Executive Secretary has enough to do without taking on that exercise. Does anyone want to volunteer their time and computer skills to collect and maintain such a list? Let us know.

Thanks to all of you who have expressed your concerns along with ideas. That is part of what will help keep DTGCA a vital organization. Be safe and see you on the trail. - - -Kent

## MINUTES FROM BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING FEBRUARY 14, 2009

February 14, 2009

The scheduled meeting of the DTGCA Board of Directors was held Saturday evening, February 14, 2009 at 5:30 p.m. directly following the close of the show at the Ramkota Inn, Sioux Falls, SD. Present were President Kent Miller, Executive Secretary Vicki Sandvig, Directors Lenard Cave, Hal Lee, Don Glynn, Chuck Harens, Bernie Larson and Gerald Groenewold. Absent were directors Daethal Docktor, Roger Krumm and Bill Braun. President Kent Miller recognized a quorum present.

To accommodate guests present, President Kent Miller introduced Paul Marsolek of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms & Explosives, BATF&E. Mr. Marsolek gave a brief presentation from the Bureau and left posters for all the show managers. Executive Secretary read the minutes of January 3, 2009. Gerald Groenewold moved to accept the minutes as read. Lenard Cave seconded the motion, all ayes, carried.

President Kent Miller recognized representatives from the Ramkota Inn Karla Pfiefer and Jan Gruenwaldt. They were invited to attend for a question and answer period with the Directors for consideration of contract signing for their facility.

President Kent Miller recognized representatives from the Sioux Falls Convention Center Rachael Miller and Ally Bracket. They too were invited to attend for a question and answer period with the Directors for consideration of contract signing for their facility. Further questions for either facility representatives will be done in writing.

Old business was opened with tabled topics from past meetings. President Kent Miller stated the Board Meeting minutes will be posted in the quarterly Newsletter so membership is well informed. President Kent Miller shared with the Board input from other gun show associations and their process in running their shows.

New business was opened with discussion on the Fall Gun Show held in Sioux Falls, SD. Don Glynn moved to override the motion made by Bill Braun, seconded by Daethal Docktor at the January 3, 2009 Board of Directors meeting stating to move the Fall Gun Show to the Sioux Falls Convention Center and moved to have the Fall Gun Show, managed by Steve Livermore, remain at the Ramkota Inn, Sioux Falls, SD. Bernie Larson seconded the move, unanimous ayes, carried. Chuck Harens moved to reimburse Steve Livermore on his mileage expenses to and from Sioux Falls, SD working with the Ramkota Inn and the Sioux Falls Convention Center. Gerald Groenewold seconded the move, unanimous ayes, carried. Requests for bids will be obtained from vendors of promotional material for the design, quantity and cost of the new 2010 Belt Buckle. Executive Secretary Vicki Sandvig will send a letter of request. Buckle criteria is to have the DTGCA logo and be made of a solid metal. Don Glynn moved to "self insure" the office and promotional assets housed at the Executive Secretary's home and to have the association's attorney draw up a "Hold Harmless" letter for the Board of Directors to sign. Hal Lee seconded the move, unanimous ayes, carried. Discussion on the Brookings Show tabled until the Summer Meeting of 2009. Due to lack of motion, request for funding from the North American Game Warden Museum was not approved. Hal Lee moved with Bernie Larson's second to advertise for a show manager for the Mitchell, SD show in the newsletter. Unanimous ayes, carried. No action was taken on the Sioux Falls Trophy Show manager. The Board of Directors did not reinstate the Huron Show due to no motion made to override the previous decision to cancel the show at the Board of Directors meeting February 9, 2008. The contribution request from the National Field Archery Association in Yankton was received late. Hal Lee moved to review the application and a vote will be cast through the US mail. Gerald Groenewold seconded the move, unanimous ayes, carried. Attorney services will be requested for advice on handling the alleged theft by a vendor and their subsequent refusal to leave the premises when asked to do so by show manager Chuck Harens at the Sioux Falls Trophy Show.

The next scheduled meeting of the Board of Director will be the Summer Meeting, July 18, 2009 in Aberdeen, SD.

Hal Lee moved with Bernie Larson's second to adjourn the meeting at 7:40 p.m. all ayes, meeting adjourned.
