February 2, 2013 Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the DTGCA was held Saturday February 2, 2013 at the Ramkota Hotel, Aberdeen, SD directly following the close of the show for the day. Present were President Bruce Foster, Executive Secretary Vicki Sandvig, Directors Daethal Docktor, Dean Sandvig, Cliff Wasfaret, Larry Jones, Don Glynn and Kelly Lorge. Directors absent were Bill Braun, Bernie Larson and Sonny Pesicka. There were a total of 42 in attendance. President Bruce Foster established a Quorum was present and opened the meeting for business.

The Executive Secretary Vicki Sandvig read the minutes from 3-17-2012. Steve Livermore moved with Bob Campbell's second to approve the minutes as read. All ayes, motion carried. The 2012 Annual Report was presented to the membership. Bob Campbell moved with Jim Keller's second to accept the Annual Report as presented. All ayes, motion carried.

Roger Krumm moved with Rocky Reule's second nominations cease, all ayes, carried. Rick O (19) Bernie L (6) Steve L (7); **Rick Oleson is a new South Dakota Director**.

This very special Savage 1899 303 caliber rifle was a prize won by H.B. Williams in 1904. He had out shot *Buffalo Bill Cody* at Madison Square Garden. H.B. was a well known actor and he and his wife were both shooters. He worked for *Bill Cody* for 8 years. All of his guns were handed down to his only son after he passed away. Due to unfortunate circumstances the guns later were sold as needed and the last two ended up in Butte, MT. 12 years later we purchased them and tracked down the family. H.B.'s granddaughter was thrilled the guns were going into a collection and shared the history and pictures of her wonderful grandfather.

This Savage 303 caliber has a "Fancy American Walnut" stock with grade "C" checkering. Engraved with grade "A" engraving.

Owners Clarence and Janet Parks of Roundup, MT have shown this piece along with several other long guns that have won many awards at the Dakota Territory Shows.

DISPLAY TITLE —FIREARMS ENGRAVING BY NEIL HARTLIEP—



The Display title is taken from his NRA publication, by that name, for gunsmithing schools. Displayed were firearms that had been engraved by Neil Hartliep. He had decided, as a farm boy from northwestern Iowa, that he wanted to do that work. He started with tools that he made, for his use. He designed many "tools of the trade". All of the displayed firearms, with one exception, were done in "Relief Engraving" style. The "Over/Under" "Frigun Gun" (sold by trapshooter Frenzy Frigun) was one of Mr. Hartliep's trap guns, and he did "Incise Engraving" on it. The gun was meant to be used much, and that style of engraving does not show wear as soon, and the inlaid gold is not as heavy and deep. Heavier, and deeper, gold inlays can shake loose from constant recoil.

"Relief Engraving" has more evident 3-D look, and feel, to it than "Incised Engraving" does. In the display are three S&W revolvers. Two of these were made in 1952, which happened to be S&W's 100th Anniversary. They are four inch barreled Model 15 and 17 with the serial numbers both ending "811". They are engraved, as much as humanly possible, exactly the same. The third revolver is a Model 19-3 and has gold wire inlays on it. The three Winchester Model 12's are two 12 gauge, and a 16 gauge that has a second barrel assembly that was added years after originally made. It must have been someone's "Good Old Favorite", since it appears to have had very little use after being embellished. The engraving on the barrel sets match, and the "non-factory" wood is special, being "carved and checkered". (A comment about this Model 12—"Retired in Style"!)

One of the 12 Gauges can be traced back to the original owner, and also a retired shooter. The Model 12's were acquired at DTGCA, Tulsa and Las Vegas gun shows. The revolvers, in the display and Mr. Hartliep's double barrel, were acquired from a friend of Mr. Hartliep. Author Alvin Olson, Waseca, MN

THE ITHACA NID GRADE 4 double with elevated ventilated rib; single selective trigger; and Beavertail forend was a combination advocated by such gun experts of the time as Charles Young Grand American Handicap winner in trap and O.N. Ford manager of the Pacific International trap shooting association. He pronounced it as the greatest trap and waterfowl gun yet produced.

The price at the time for such a gun was \$120.00 with ejectors and extras included a vent rib \$30.00, single selective trigger \$30.00, Beavertail forend \$20.00, recoil pad \$2.00, Lyman Ivory sights \$1.00.

The example in this display comes with gold inlays of a Cock pheasant on the right side and a flying duck on the left. Engraving is full coverage on the receiver, trigger guard and forend. Checkering is fine and the black walnut stock and forend is outstanding. I purchase this fine example of a grade 4 in 2006 and have not seen one better to date. A fairly scarce gun with some 560 being made during the NID era. I suspect the bulk of them were in 12 gauge although I have seen one or two 16 gauges advertised for sale. It frequently draws comments with part of the NID displays.

THE MISTERY OF THE SAVAGE 22 CRACK SHOT

I moved to Breckenridge, MN in 1960 to man the City Engineers office for a Engineering firm that had a contract to furnish the engineering services for the city. My office was in the city hall close to the police office so I became friends with all the policemen and everyone else in the city hall. Shortly after arriving, I purchased a old Savage 22 Crack Shot Rifle from one of the policemen. I do not remember how much I paid for it, but I know it wasn't very much, only a few dollars. The rifle has been in my possession for over 50 years. I have other Steven's Crack Shots similar to it, however, it had its forearm replaced with what appeared to be part of a 1903 style military forearm. It appeared to me to have been used by a child as a toy or maybe use by a trapper because the replaced fore arm had a bayonet lug which would work well for such activity. Anyway, during the long winter of 2012-13, I finally got around to restoring some of my old rifles which I had been planning to do for many years, and which included this mistyry one. I removed the military fore arm and made a new one to replace it. Of course I had to remove the stock as well to refinish it. When I remove the butt plate I found a small piece of paper with a name and the city Mound, MN on it tucked into a screw hole. When I showed the note to my grand daughters husband, he immediately Googled the name on his phone and discovered the name still appeared as a listing with a telephone number in Mound, MN. I decided to stop and see my former policeman friend, who is now retired, to find out how he came to own the gun, however he did not remember owning it or selling it to me. I then called the phone number in Mound, MN and found out the person listed on the note was still alive and he remembered the gun well. He was a very young boy living on a farm near Lankin, ND, and because the water on their farm wasn't fit to drink, they went to a neighbor to get some potable water. When at the neighbors the young foy found the rifle in the well house. The fore arm was missing and the gun was not in the best shape, so the neighbor gave it to the young boy. The boy enlisted the help of a much older brother, who had refurbished or in other words sporterized a 1903 springfield rifle, to install the old 1903 fore arm on the younger boys new found rifle. The young boy, now a 78 year old man, used his new found rifle like most young farm boys of that age, to hunt and plink as he grew up. He told me if that rifle could talk, it could tell a very interesting and extensive story about when it was in his possession. He eventerlly move to the twin cities where he traded the gun at a gun shop for a 38 police special hand gun which he told me he still has. I still don't know how the gun got from the gun shop to my police man friends hands.
